2. Chairman's Report

Sport is a numbers game – not the number of goals you need to score to win a game but the number of people playing your sport. The number of people participating in our sport is our number one performance indicator.

In a year which saw participation numbers in Australia dropping, WA is the only state that has increased from the previous year. Importantly, the number of participants is used by all levels of Government in their policy and operational decision setting processes.

Appropriate pool space still inhibits the growth of our sport. Again, we met with the Minister to press upon him this lack of appropriate water space. Whilst he was sympathetic, he was however not about to hand over millions of dollars to water polo to build new pools. This leaves water polo with having to forge better relationships with local government and other pool owners. There is, however, some good news with the City of Stirling slowly moving closer to the Hamersley Golf Course re-development, which includes a pool. The project has move onto the appointment of a project manager and the council has indicated it will welcome WAWPI's input. I would like to formally thank Ms. Jann McFarlane (ex Australian MP & Stirling City Councillor) for her assistance in this matter.

Flippa ball programs now being run at Joondalup Arena and the Terry Tyzak Aquatic Centre are continuing thanks to Venus West, the Phantoms Water Polo Club and Somerset's program at Wesley College should bring benefits for the club, the school and the sport.

I had previously reported that in a meeting between myself, the previous WAWPI CEO Michelle Phillips-Kiely and the Minister for Sport and Recreation, WAWPI pressed the need for better planning associated with aquatic facilities. I can now report that after nearly three years the development of the WA Strategic Aquatics Facility Plan for the greater metropolitan area has been completed.

The document details the aquatic requirements of swimming, diving and water polo and will hopefully shape Government decision making for the foreseeable future. My hope is that the plan does not just sit on a shelf but leads to water polo's requirements being built into future aquatic facility developments.

As reported last year the association maintains a strong financial position which will again allow the undertaking of planned strategic growth initiatives with no related financial impact on current clubs and their members.

Congratulations to all players, coaches and officials selected to represent the state at National Championships and selection in national teams and squads. Congratulations also to the Fremantle Mariners for capturing yet another NWPL title.

My thanks to all Board members for their efforts during the year. To those that are seeking to continue, there is much still to do and for those that are retiring from Board duties, I greatly appreciate your efforts.

During the year, Simon Tiverios received an offer he couldn't refuse and resigned as WAWPI CEO, our best wishes to Simon. Following the advertising and selection process the Board appointed Dale Ballantyne to the vacant position. Dale brings a wealth of experience from the AFL area with him and in a short time is proving to be an asset to the organisation.

Thank you to the Board, Simon Tiverios, Tibor Seress, Sharan Colliss, Liz Burman and Chenelle Pappas for their continued work. Thank you also to the Department of Sport and Recreation, Healthway, Cancer Council of WA, WA Institute of Sport (WAIS), Challenge Stadium and Australian Water Polo Incorporated for their ongoing support of water polo in WA.

3. Chief Executive Officers Report

As a CEO who has only spent one month in the position as at the end of the 2010/11 year, it is quite difficult to reflect on the year that has passed.

Water polo is a very successful sport, despite its relatively low profile in the WA sporting scene. A very successful introductory program into the sport within the Flippa Ball area, successful junior and youth competitions, which are well complemented through our private school and Independent Girls School competitions highlight this statement. Senior water polo in WA at both state and national level also appears to be in reasonable shape, but we need to work together within all of these areas to strengthen our position amongst our sporting peers within WA.

WAWPI has been efficient in running competitions at state level, ensuring that state teams are able to compete at a national level and encouraged clubs to maintain their involvement with the national carnival programs at 14 & 16 & under ages. This level of support will need to be continued into the 2011/12 season.

I feel that communication is the key to building a stronger water polo fraternity within WA as we will continue to look at ways to grow, develop and market our game. In my initial time in the role of CEO, I can see some opportunities for the sport to deliver great outcomes for key stakeholders of water polo which includes our National League teams as well as the established clubs within our structure. Opportunities may include increased media profile, building a WAWPI brand in conjunction with our stakeholders and also creating some sponsorship. I look forward to helping create these opportunities and working with our clubs to achieve state level outcomes.

WAWPI again received considerable financial support from the State Government in the Healthway Sponsorship and the Department of Sport and Recreation. We have worked in a cohesive manner with both Departments to ensure the continuation of this funding. More than that, it is our desire to see both Departments achieving the results they wish to obtain through their support, as it is this that will seal our continued and even increased levels of future financial support.

Referees, coaches, club officials and all other volunteers are the backbone of sport in Australia and within WAWPI, we are blessed to have some of the best. I would like to take the time to once again recognise your efforts as you endeavour to make your club, team or group as progressive and successful as possible.

Finally to the Board of WAWPI and our Competition and Development Officer, Tibor Seress, your work over the previous twelve months has been of the highest quality in sometimes difficult circumstances. Having a six month period with no-one filling the position of CEO is not easy and I congratulate you on what you have achieved during this time. I look forward to successfully implementing some strategic initiatives in the next 12 month period as we continue to build the sport of water polo in WA.

4. High Performance

4.1. WAIS Men's Report

The WAIS Men's Water Polo Program enjoyed a fruitful 2010/11 campaign that included a win in the National T Challenge (NTC) whilst a strong WAIS contingent helped the Fremantle Mariners to a National Water Polo League (NWPL) victory. The Australian Sharks again competed strongly internationally, with a strong representation of WAIS athletes wearing the green and gold during the year.

The year began with James Stanton, Nick O'Halloran, Joel Swift and Aaron Younger gaining selection for the national team for the 2010 World League Finals in Nis, Serbia. The Australian team finished fourth with wins over Croatia, South Africa and Spain.

Stanton, O'Halloran, Swift and Younger were then selected for Australia's squad for the World Cup in Oradea, Romania, with the Sharks finishing sixth.

WAIS scholarship holders Edward Slade, James Fannon, Perry Short and Nick Redbond were all selected to tour with the National Junior Team to Europe where they trained with the Croatian men's team and junior team before finishing third in a tournament in Macedonia after losses to the hosts and Serbia's B national team.

The Australian National Junior Team's tour of Europe continued into August, with Edward Slade, James Fannon, Perry Short and Nick Redbond all playing in a junior tournament in Kazan, Russia. The Australian team finished third behind Serbia and Italy, with Edward Slade named goal keeper of the tournament.

In September, new WAIS scholarships were offered to athletes Sam Quinn, George Ford, Dimitri Stamatis, Luca Altieri and Bill Christensen.

Aaron Younger accepted a professional contract to play for Hungarian Club side Szeged. Szeged participates in the First division in Hungary and the Euro League.

WAIS was crowned NTC Challenge champions in November for the first time since 1987. WAIS coach Paul Oberman led athletes Luke Quinlivan, Sam Quinn, Tim Cleland, Nick O'Halloran, Nick Redbond, Jamie Beadsworth, George Ford, Dimitri Stamatis, Joel Swift, James Fannon, Luca Altieri, Daniel Lawrence and Edward Slade to a 9-8 extra time win over NSWIS in the final, after four wins and one loss in qualification.

In December, Joel Swift was voted WAIS Player's Player for the year by his peers, winning the accolade by a single vote from teammates Aaron Younger and Edward Slade.

December also hosted the Annual Tom Hoad Cup, with the Fremantle Mariners competing against national teams from China and Japan, club side Szeged, and a Barbarians Team composite of the National Junior squad. The Mariners line up included WAIS athletes; Jamie Beadsworth, Tim Cleland, James Fannon, Daniel Lawrence, Nick O'Halloran, Sam Quinn, Nick Redbond, Eddie Slade and Joel Swift, whilst Aaron Younger represented his professional club side Szeged and WAIS juniors Perry Short, George Ford, Luca Altieri and Dimitri Stamatis represented the Barbarians.

January kick started 2011 with the Australian 20 & under Championship in Perth. WA Gold claimed bronze with a win over NSW Waratahs in the play-off, with WAIS athletes Edward Slade, James Fannon, Nick Redbond, Sam Quinn, Dimitri Stamatis, George Ford, Luca Altieri and Jayden Smith all featuring.

Following the Championships, Edward Slade, James Fannon, Nick Redbond, Sam Quinn, George Ford, Aaron Younger and Perry Short were all named in the Australian under 20 squad for the World Junior Championships later in the year.

The NWPL commenced in February with all WAIS scholarship holders represented in either the Fremantle Mariners or UWA Torpedoes squads.

Joel Swift and Aaron Younger were selected for the Australian team that claimed silver in the Volvo Cup in Hungary following wins over Canada and Germany.

Fremantle Mariners were crowned Southern Cross Trophy winners in April after finishing the regular season on top of the ladder. The Mariners were represented by; Edward Slade, Jaime Beadsworth, Tim Cleland, Joel Swift, Nick O 'Halloran, James Fannon, Nick Redbond, Daniel Lawrence, Sam Quinn, Luca Altieri and Jayden Smith. The UWA Torpedoes finished tenth and missed out on finals. WAIS athletes; Luke Quinlivan, George Ford and Dimitri Stamatis featured for the club.

Tim Cleland, Joel Swift, Nick O 'Halloran, Edward Slade and Daniel Lawrence were all selected for the Southern Team in the inaugural National League All Star Team. Jamie Beadsworth was selected to play but withdrew due to injury. WAIS coach Paul Oberman was named co-coach of the South team that went on to defeat North in a penalty shootout.

WA Gold finished second at the National 18 & under Championships in Brisbane behind NSW Blues. Paul Oberman coached the group, with WAIS athletes Luca Altieri, Jayden Smith, George Ford and Dimitri Stamatis all part of the team. Altieri and Ford were named in the All Star Tournament seven.

Tim Cleland, Joel Swift, Daniel Lawrence, Nick O'Halloran and Luke Quinlivan were selected to compete in the World League Asia/Oceania Preliminary Round in Auckland, New Zealand. Australia defeats New Zealand, Kazakhstan, Japan and China to comfortably win the first leg, before finalising qualification in China.

In June, Tim Cleland, Luke Quinlivan, Aaron Younger and Joel Swift were selected to tour Europe with the Australian team. Australia competed in the Pescara Tournament in Italy, finishing fourth, before joining with Hungary for a training camp and friendly, which Hungary won.

The World League Finals were hosted in Florence, Italy in June, with Luke Quinlivan, Tim Cleland, Joel Swift and Aaron Younger all featuring for Australia as they finished sixth, after losing the fifth placed play-off against Montenegro.

4.2 WAIS Women's Report

The WAIS Women's Water Polo program had a successful 12 months which included three members earning silver medals at the FINA Women's World Cup in Christchurch, New Zealand in August after they were defeated by eventual champion USA.

In July, Gemma Beadsworth, Glencora Ralph and Zoe Arancini were included in Australian Stingers Squad to travel to California for the FINA World League Super Final to collect silver medal after losing with penalty shot out at the gold medal game against world number one USA.

Also in July, Eliesha Browne, Rachel Flint and Claire Pierce were all included in the National under 20 Team to travel to Auckland, New Zealand and Los Angeles, California. The team had successful test series with New Zealand Senior Women's and collected silver medal on the tournament in Los Alamitos.

Dorottya Szilagyi, Millie Martino and Jessica Zimmermann also travelled to New Zealand in July with the National 16 & under squad to play in the Pan Pacific Tournament followed by three test matches with New Zealand's 17 & under team.

Early July, WAIS athletes Cathryn Earl (captain), Matil Connor and Eloise Pierce were selected for the National 17 & under team to travel to Europe. The young Australian team finished second behind Hungary in the Pythia Cup in Itea, Greece and came fifth in Emmen, Netherlands.

The WAIS Women's Squad participated in the Institute Challenge at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), Canberra in November. Gemma Beadsworth, Zoe Arancini and Glencora Ralph received AIS scholarship after outstanding performance on the competition. All three players travelled to North America in December with the Australian Stingers.

In December, Jessica Zimmermann played for the Australian School girls' team in Great Britain and New Zealand.

The 20 and under National Championships were held in Perth at Challenge Stadium at the end of January. WAIS Athletes Zoe Arancini (captain), Rachel Flint, Cathryn Earl, Matil Coco Connor, Eloise Pierce, Jessica Zimmermann and Millie Martino all been selected for the WA Team, finished third. The WA Gold Team coached by WAIS Assistant Coach Georgina Kovacs.

In early April, the Australian National 18 & under team travelled to Hawaii for test matches at Duke Kahanamoku Aquatic Complex, Honolulu. Three WAIS athletes – Cathryn Earl, Eloise Pierce and Matil Connor – were selected for the tour.

In April, WAIS Head Coach Peter Szilagyi took the WA 18 & under team to Brisbane for the National Championships. The WA Gold Team were undefeated after the round robin preliminary round, but lost the final against the powerful home team Queensland Maroon. WAIS athletes Eloise Pierce, Matil Connor, Cathryn Earl, Jessica Zimmermann, Dorottya Szilagyi and new scholarship holder Mercedes Ralph all played for the WA State Team.

After the NWPL Final the Stingers travelled to New Zealand for the World League Preliminary Round. The team included Gemma Beadsworth and Glencora Ralph. The second round was held in Sydney. The Australian Senior Team won all six games and finished first into the Oceania – Asia Group.

The Australian 20 & under national team played in the second round of the World League in Sydney and won two games (Japan, New Zealand), lost twice (Australia, China). Zoe Arancini and Eliesha Browne were selected for the 20 & under national team.

Ebony Neesham was named for the Australian University Team to travel to China for the World University Games later on this year.

In June, the Stingers travelled to Europe and Asia, with Gemma Beadsworth, Glencora Ralph and Zoe Arancini making the travelling squad. The Australian Team collected a silver medal in Kristi, Russia in the Kristi Cup and bronze medal in Tianjin, China in the FINA World League Super Final.

5. Sports Development

5.1. Competition & Development Manager's Report

WAWPI has had some great challenges in the past season due to the resignation of the WAWPI CEO Simon Tiverios before the second half of our calendar year.

At the same time, a few new structural alterations have been implemented for the purpose of growing, developing our sport and improving consistency on the operational side.

20 & Under National Championships in Perth 2011 January

At the tournament both the WA Gold Boys and Girls finished third, which is a very good achievement at this level. The WA Black Boys team, which was a quite young group, finished in sixth position.

If we look at the whole tournament the WA boys had the potential to win the gold medal but in the semi final the team could not perform its best against Queensland.

The bronze medal for our girl's team was more realistic finish and a credit to them.

On behalf of WAPI I would like to thank to all coordinators and volunteers who helped us in hosting the 20 & Under State National Championships this year.

18 & Under National Championships in Brisbane

WA sent two boys and two girl's teams for the 18 & under state championships to Brisbane in the end of April 2011. It was fantastic to have four WA teams competing at this important National Championships.

Both the girls and boys WA Gold team claimed silver medals with outstanding and consistent performances for the whole tournament. Unfortunately, in the gold medal games the opposition states played better water polo but having said that there is no reason for us to be disappointed.

There is no doubt that WA has great future with these two really important second places at the Nationals. I also need to mention that our younger teams, the WA Black teams, improved a lot through the tournament and at the end finished in seventh place.

Our appreciation also goes to the coaches and managers who worked with the WA State Teams this year.

16 & under Club National Championships

The 16 & unders had eight teams from four WA clubs.

A fantastic performance from Melville Sharks saw them take home the gold Medal, while the UWA-City Beach combined team finished in fifth place.

The girls did not perform as well as the boys, but a sixth place for Melville, seventh for Dolphins and a Triton girl's team, who closed in twenty first place, was a good effort out of twenty four teams.

14 & under Club National Championships

On the 14 & under Club Nationals in Canberra eight teams from three clubs represented WA.

Melville had great results with two medals, silver for girls and bronze for boys. City Beach claimed fourth for boys and fifth for girls and the best result for Dolphins was eighth place with their girls.

Premier League

In our local state competitions, Men's Premier League had five teams competing with Booragoon a new addition from south of the river in 2010/2011.

The Women's Premier League had four teams without any composite side which is an improvement from last year.

The season was extended and games were played throughout the 2011 National League season. In the extended part of the league not all clubs could adjust well to the new fixtures therefore WAWPI will reconsider the draw for next year.

Melville Water Polo Club was once again the dominant club for both genders taking out the Grand Finals.

State League Seniors

Our Senior State League was quite dynamic with many teams competing in every division using six different venues and multiple pools at Challenge Stadium. The season went well and we enjoyed some great performances on every level, especially in the finals.

Unfortunately there were too many forfeits at Rockingham's Aquatic Centre, due to teams not being prepared to travel to compete against Peel Water Polo Club. These teams were mainly in Division 1 and 2 women and this issue needs to be addressed if we want to grow the sport in WA.

In our newly adopted system where clubs are responsible to enter results online we had teething problems in this first year due to a lack of results being entered. We will work with the clubs to help address this problem in 2011/12.

State League Juniors

The junior competition has grown with the number of teams and members participating compared to previous years which is a good sign.

WAWPI will look to gain more pool space at Challenge Stadium so the 14 & under A division teams can play on twenty five metre fields which help a lot in their development.

Thanks to our coordinators who did really well on the Monday night games and many new junior referees were developed throughout the season.

Masters Competitions

The Masters community has also grown with many new teams competing on Tuesday nights at the water polo pool in UWA. The master's league and its vibrant atmosphere seem to attract more players year by year, which is another fantastic improvement for our sport and its members in WA.

Thank you again to the WA Masters Sub-Committee in assisting between the members and the state association.

Underpinning Program

Due to the Support of the Department of Sport And Recreation, we were once again able to run an underpinning program. This program continues to introduce our young players to the national program through our WAIS connection and will be reviewed and improved annually.

5.2. Referees

While it appeared that most teams were prepared for the season with the new changes to the competition rules others took time to utilise them and gain an understanding of changes. The need for consistency at all levels was recognised by the refereeing panel during the year and the improvement of consistency in many of the Premier League matches was evident.

The “Green Shirt” programme has been a success for water polo, but there is a need to educate spectators on the role of the green shirt referees, so that people are aware of the abilities of the referees.

There is also a challenge in having two referees in some senior competitions due to a lack of qualified referees. The preference for the commission will be to recruit, retain and in some circumstances extend the use of experienced referees, who are to play at the pool that evening to step in to assist.

The major concern for the referees in 2010/11 was the attitude of coaches and parents towards referees at all levels of our game. This problem needs to be addressed and clubs need to step in to enforce the appropriate code of conduct required to make our game enjoyable and fun to be involved in. Pamphlets will be issued to parents in 2011, WAWPI Board members will be approached to help pool co-ordinators and the judiciary will be encouraged to support referees in a bid to stamp out this element. It is an issue that everyone needs to be involved with.

Referees have also put a recommendation that helpers on game days at the official tables need some guidance on their duties. WAWPI and the referees will be working together to have some helper cards at all tables throughout the season to make this job easier and once again take some pressure of the referees.

Country appointments:

The WAWPI referees commission assisted with refereeing in Port Hedland, Geraldton, Bunbury and Busselton during the season. Five Perth based referees also assisted with the WA Country Championships in Bunbury. The commission and WAWPI will continue to work with the WACWPA to educate and increase the standard of refereeing.

Highlights of season 2010/11:

- Gabor Boros had risen to international status with a trip to Hawaii with a national under-age women’s team. He is to be congratulated on this achievement.
- Gabor and Mark Ridgwell officiated at the recent NWPL Finals Series.
- Mark, Liz Burman and Sasha Kovalenko controlled games at the 20 & Under Nationals.
- Fiona Haigh, Mark, Sasha, Richard Fagen and Alan Taylor attended the 18s nationals.
- Gary Payne and Liz were the main referees appointed by AWPI at the recent Australian Country titles.

There were some positive steps taken in the refereeing area in 2010/11 and we look to build on this as we move into the next season. Thanks to everyone who helped out and gave up time to make the games run.

5.6. NATIONAL LEAGUE
